England & Arsenal Goal-keeping Legend

One of the country's most decorated footballers. When the Rotherham born goalkeeper retired from the game in 2004, he had won 75 England caps and had made 954 club appearances in all, 563 of them being with Arsenal.

David helped Arsenal win three league titles, three FA cups, one League Cup and the European Cup Winners' Cup. He was England's number one keeper at the 1998 and 2002 World Cup finals, and was in the squad at the 1990 World Cup finals.

He began his playing career when he joined Peterborough in 1992. He also played for Birmingham City and Queens Park Rangers before Manager George Graham took him to Arsenal. He then went on to make 26 league and cup appearances for Manchester City before hanging up his boots and gloves.
