Ashley D. Farmer is a well-known historian as well as an Assistant Professor at the University of Texas at Austin. As a contributor to *The Washington Post*, *The Independent*, *The Chronicle of Higher Education*, and *Public Books*, she is well-versed in making historical issues and concepts accessible to the general public.

As an expert in African American History, Black Political organizing, and African American women's history, she is a sought after voice in national conversations about race, gender, and social justice as evidenced by her contributions and interviews with NPR, The History Channel, and the New York Times. Her most recent book, *Remaking Black Power: How Black Women Transformed an Era* (UNC Press, 2017) was short listed for numerous awards, won two honorable mentions for awards in African American and African American women's history and has received praise in both scholarly and popular outlets. She is also the Co-Editor and Curator of the Black Power Series with Ibram X. Kendi, published with NYU Press.
