Presidential Historian; Author

Dr. Lindsay M. Chervinsky is a historian of the presidency, political culture, and U.S. government institutions. She is a Senior Fellow at the Center for Presidential History at Southern Methodist University. Previously, she was a historian at the White House Historical Association and a fellow at the Kluge Center at the Library of Congress. She received her B.A. in history and political science from the George Washington University, and completed her masters and Ph.D. from the University of California, Davis.

Dr. Chervinsky is the author of the award-winning <u>The Cabinet: George Washington and the Creation of an American</u> <u>Institution</u>, which was published by Belknap / Harvard University Press in April 2020 and the co-editor of <u>Mourning</u> <u>the Presidents: Loss and Legacy in American Culture</u> published by University of Virginia Press in February 2023. Her third book, <u>Making the Presidency: John Adams and the Precedents that Forged the Republic</u>, will be published by Oxford University Press in September 2024.

Dr. Chervinsky has been published in the <u>Washington Post</u>, <u>TIME</u>, <u>USA Today</u>, <u>CNN.com</u>, <u>The Bulwark</u>, <u>The Wall Street</u> <u>Journal</u>, <u>Washington Monthly</u>, <u>The Daily Beast</u>, and numerous others; she is a regular source on American history for outlets like <u>The BBC</u>, <u>Associated Press</u>, <u>Washington Post</u>, <u>New York Times</u>, <u>CBC News</u>, and many more. She has recently appeared on <u>CBS News</u> and <u>CNN</u>.
