

## Adm. Michael Rogers

Former Director, National Security Agency & Former Commander, US Cyber Command

### **The Shifting Cyber Security Threat Landscape.**

As the second-ever commander of U.S. Cyber Command, Admiral Michael Rogers was instrumental in building up the capacity and capabilities of the agency, now a combatant force of hackers, analysts, and staffers all focused on America's most-pressing cyber security challenges. Here, Admiral Rogers offers a window into the role he played in the formation of U.S. cyber policy and practice, and answers questions like:

- How can organizations keep their systems secure in the 21<sup>st</sup> century?
- What actors should we be worried about and how ought we to respond to a crisis?
- What are the defensive and offensive strategies groups should employ?
- How will America stay ahead of the cyber security curve?

Offering both a technical perspective and a policy perspective that looks at pertinent issues domestically and globally, Rogers argues for an allied government, industry, and private sector approach to ensure American prosperity and peace.

### **American Intelligence in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century.**

For the past four as NSA Chief, Admiral Michael Rogers sat at the helm of the world's largest intelligence organization outside of Beijing and Moscow. Focused on creating a clear vision of American intelligence for the future, Rogers worked to create an understand of what intelligence will look like 10-20 years into the future and the skill sets that will be needed to stay ahead of our adversaries. Here, Rogers takes audiences into the Pentagon and Oval Office to provide an overview of the big issues keeping intelligence officials up at night and the ways American intelligence will evolve in the coming decades.

### **The State of American National Security.**

With this speech, Admiral Rogers brings groups up to speed on the major challenges that will define the next era of national security. With wide-ranging experience managing our national response to issues ranging from state and non-state-sponsored aggressions and the new frontier of cyber warfare to the migrant crisis and climate change, Rogers breaks down the why, what, and how of our biggest national security threats. An eye-opening, thrilling, and informative talk, Rogers highlights looming security threats and their potential implications.

### **Leadership Lessons from the Highest Levels of Government.**

Admiral Rogers assumed control of the NSA, the largest intelligence organization in the US government—with a multi-billion-dollar budget and global team of military, civilian, and contractor employees that numbered in the tens of thousands—in 2014, at a time of incredible change. Inheriting an organization reeling from a crisis of public confidence and the resulting internal challenges, Rogers went about with the largest restructuring since before 9/11. Here, he shares how leaders ought to react in the face of crisis or change, as well as the leadership lessons and tactics he learned over the course of 37 years as a Naval officer that they can draw on in their own careers. Groups are left with a better understanding of what leadership in the future will require and how to ensure their organization is optimized for success.
