Where Tyranny Begins: Our Institutions Are Failing. How Do We Fix Them? Drawing on his book *Where Tyranny Begins*, David Rohde examines how political pressure and hyperpartisanship have weakened trust in the Justice Department and FBI. He unpacks how recent presidencies exposed structural vulnerabilities in American democracy. Rohde explains why nonpartisan public servants—from election officials to judges to career investigators—are essential to preserving the rule of law. He concludes with pragmatic reforms and a clear-eyed, hopeful case for strengthening democratic institutions before further erosion takes hold.

A Rope and a Prayer: The Story of a Kidnapping. In this gripping keynote, Rohde recounts his seven months in Taliban captivity after being kidnapped while reporting in Afghanistan. He shares how dialogue, patience, and resilience shaped his survival and ultimate escape. The story offers rare insight into extremism, misinformation, and the human dynamics inside militant movements. Both harrowing and inspiring, the talk explores courage, empathy, and the enduring power of hope under extreme pressure.
