We start with the definition that data is an artifact of human experience. We need the widest variance of humans, irrespective of your role and skillset, developing AI so that everyone's story is a part of the models we are building. The intent is not to necessarily create subject matter experts but rather a pool of ambassadors who act as point people.
