**United Through Diversity** Born in Japan to an enlisted American father and a Japanese mother, Amb. Harry B. Harris' formative years were spent learning about, and embracing the diverse influences in his life. Following his father's retirement from service, his mother, a member of a wealthy Japanese family, left everything she knew behind as the Harrises began life on their Tennessee farm. As a young Amb. Harris sought to understand who he was, his mother taught him about his Japanese roots, including the American Nisei soldiers of World War II fame who join the fight for what was right, unsure of what they would return to after the war. In this talk, Amb. Harris, the highest-ranking Asian American in the U.S. Navy's history, shares his experiences breaking barriers and provides his unique perspective on diversity, what it means to him, and his beliefs on how it can positively impact an organization. He'll outline the ways in which diversity promotes healthy growth and how the condition of being different is the key to the creation of a unified culture.
